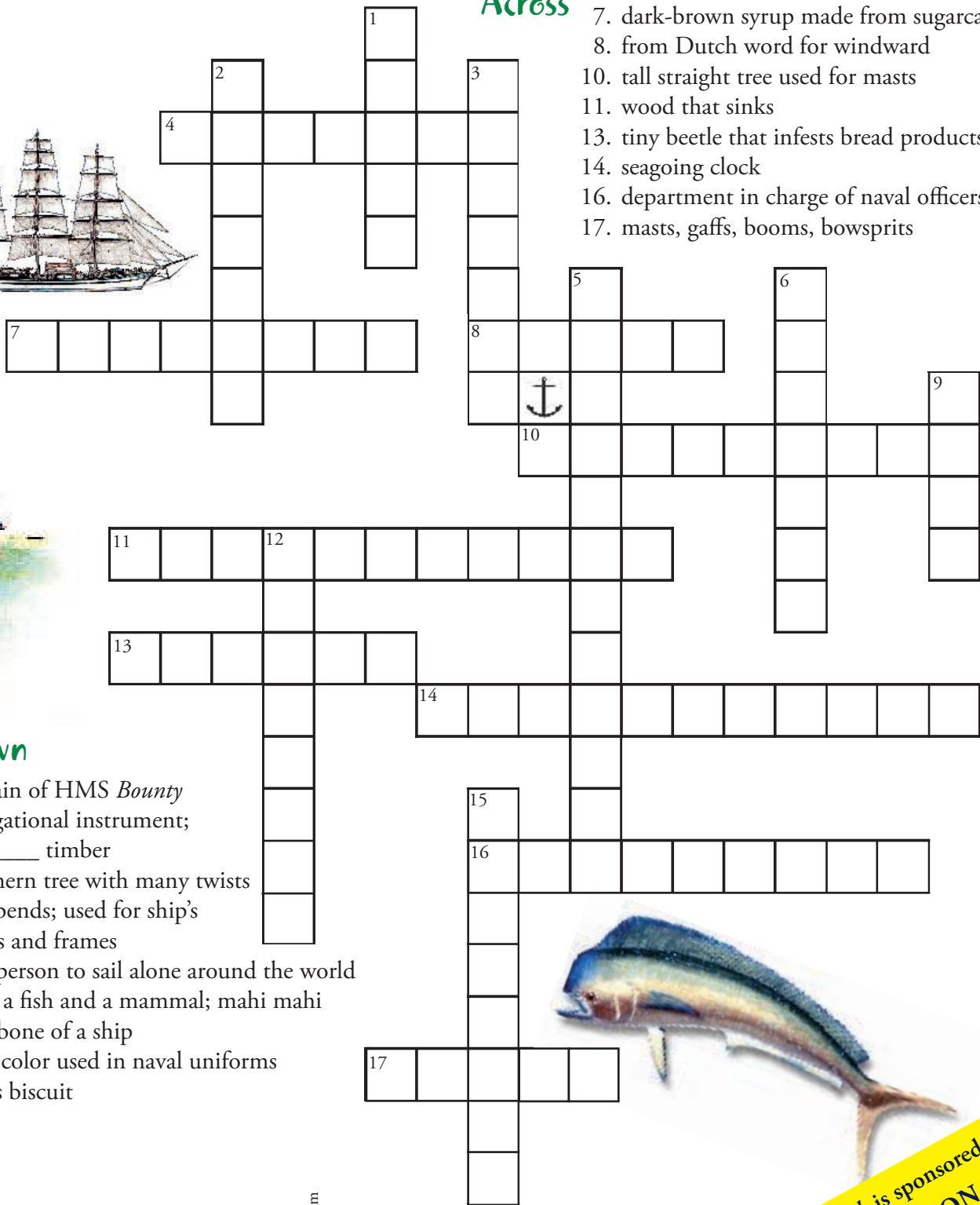


What Holds the Ship Together
